Dawlish Community Awards 2023

The retiring Mayor of Dawlish Councillor Lisa Mayne announced the recipients of the Dawlish Community Awards 2023. For the first time there were two individual categories – one for young people under 18 and one for adults – and an organisational award. Awards were presented to Cameron Bentley (youth), Nigel Rhys (adult) and two organisational awards to Assist Teignbridge and Dawlish Community Transport.

Cameron Bentley received the award in recognition of his outstanding service to Dawlish Action for Youth for the last 5 years. He has supported staff, helped at events in the local community and is now mentoring the younger senior helpers in their role at the youth club.

Seaside Award 2023

In early June the Town Beach received the Seaside Award 2023. Keep Britain Tidy's Seaside Award celebrates the quality and diversity of England's coastline. Formerly called the Quality Coast Award, the scheme is the nationwide standard for the best beaches across the UK. While Seaside Award beaches can be vastly different, the flag is a symbol of quality which ensures visitors are guaranteed to find a clean, safe, attractive, and well-managed coastal stretch. In 2022 there were 128 beaches across England awarded the Seaside Award. The Town Council is delighted to be flying the flag at the Piazza.

Recent recipients include:

- Coryton Close Community Group £250 – purchase of a powered saw to assist with tidying of the roundabout and old leat area of the Close. (The saw is available for wider community use).
- Dawlish Stamp Club £250 – part funding of a projector and stand to be used at monthly meetings.
- Citizens Advice Teignbridge £8,000 - to maintain the service for the people of Dawlish and to meet their on-going advice needs. It will be used to recruit and train volunteers and to meet the ongoing costs of providing advice e.g. premises, insurance, IT, supervision.

Community Larder and Food Banks

Dawlish Community Larder is run on behalf of Helping Dawlish by ROC Dawlish. If you know anyone who needs help, please get in touch. It is not a foodbank but will help where they can on a referral basis or ring 07584 052306 or 07729 998334. These numbers are not operated 24 hours, but they will respond as soon as possible.

Homeless in Teignbridge Support (HITS) provides support for people in need around Teignbridge. Their normal opening times are Mon-Fri, 10-4 but they have emergency cover. They need a referral from an agency such as the Citizens Advice Bureau or Job Centre, who have assessed your need. The referrer must phone HITS on 01626 906371.

Teignbridge Homeless Action Today (THAT) foodbank offer many types of support for low-income and homeless members of the community, including providing food, toiletry and home start packs, information, mentoring, fuel top-ups and more. Focus on two local organisations

The Friends of Dawlish Hospital

What do we do?

We provide funds to supplement the resources of the hospital and the community. We purchase virtually all the equipment, fixtures and fittings within the hospital building. Our fund-raising activities help but we are still very dependent on gifts, donations and bequests.

Dawlish Hospital would not have been built 25 years ago had it not been for the Friends funding 2 million pounds (at today's prices) for the supply of all internal fixtures and fittings. That included beds, kitchen equipment, ward and office furniture, televisions and a sensory garden.

Recently, we have provided the services of a Discharge Co-Ordinator, a high/low Bed, a blood fridge, a floor scrubber, a replacement floor covering for a consulting room and a bladder scanner. All this costing nearly £30,000. Regular spending is on newspapers, non-slip discharge slippers, water fountains and sensory garden maintenance. We also provide the staff with tea and coffee. They earn it!!
